### Model Course

The time estimate for each course does not include rests or tours.

#### 1 Nagara River Loop Course [5km, 1hr 40min]

On this course, you can stroll along the clear Nagara River. The view is always different, depending on the time and the season.

#### 2 Basho Course [3km, 1hr 40min]

Matsuo Basho visited Gifu in Jokyo 5 (1688). While walking this course, you can see Mt. Kinka and the Nagara River, just as they were in Basho's time.

#### 3 Kawara-machi, Gifu Park Course [2.5km, 1hr]

Many feelings of the old town and Gifu's history arise while strolling around Gifu Park. On this course, you can see the abundant nature in beautiful Gifu.

#### 4 Nobunaga, Tenka Fubu Course [4.5km, 1hr 20min]

This course displays the many places in Gifu that have ties to Oda Nobunaga. You can see Nobunaga's dream of Tenka Fubu, which was to conquer all of Japan.

#### 7 Rodin & Hanako Course [4.5km, 2hr 30min]

Hanako was the only Japanese model for Rodin's sculptures. After touring the West, she returned to Japan as an actress. In her later years, she lived quietly in Gifu. This course leads you through Hanako's world.

#### 8 Osushi Road Course [5km, 2hr 30min]

During the Edo Period, fishermen would use comorants to catch sweetfish every summer. They would bring the sweetfish sushi to the shogun using this road.

#### 9 Nakasendo, Kano-juku Course [2km, 45min]

This area was once a lively resting area. Walking along the remaining areas of the castle town and the paper umbrella district, you can enjoy the old-fashioned winding road.

#### 10 Kano Castle Town Course [3km, 2hr]

Though Tokugawa Ieyasu built Kano Castle, Okudaira Nobumasa was the first to live in it. All that remains are the ruins of the citadel and the sword-shaped moat.
